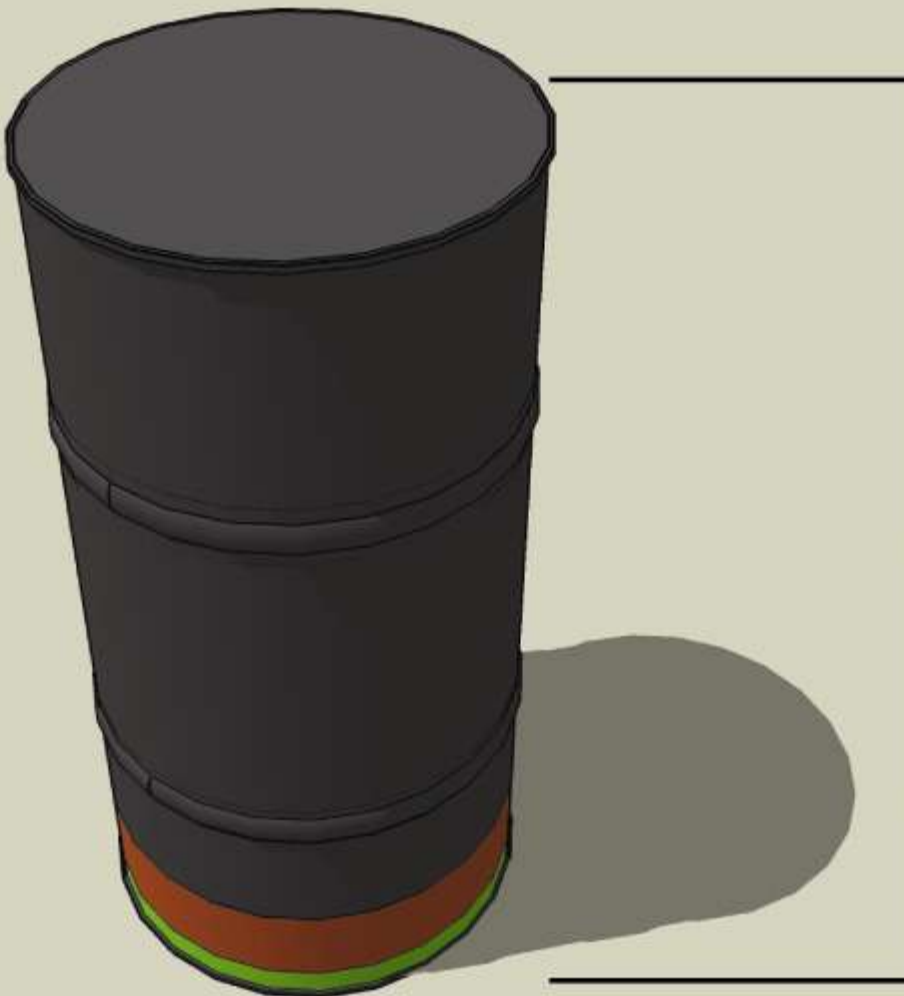

## MAP OF THE FIELDS

Heirloom Tomatoes - pick up to 3 tomatoes  
 varieties → Cherokee purple, green zebra, garden peach, Schumann's  
 Napsheart; check signs for descriptions (or ask us)

Cherry Tomatoes: Sungok, Matt's wild cherry, WA cherry <sup>open</sup>

BEANS - New planting **OPEN** (3 plantings total) → purple, green & wax

TOMATILLOS = open for picking - ← ripe when fruit grows out of husk → great for green salsa

SUNFLOWERS → pick up to 7 sunflowers

Glabolas - 5 stem limit

All other flowers **OPEN** for picking

HERBS [Basil - 3 plantings open (check field map)]  
 Rosemary, thyme, oregano, sage & chives **Open**  
 cilantro & Dill

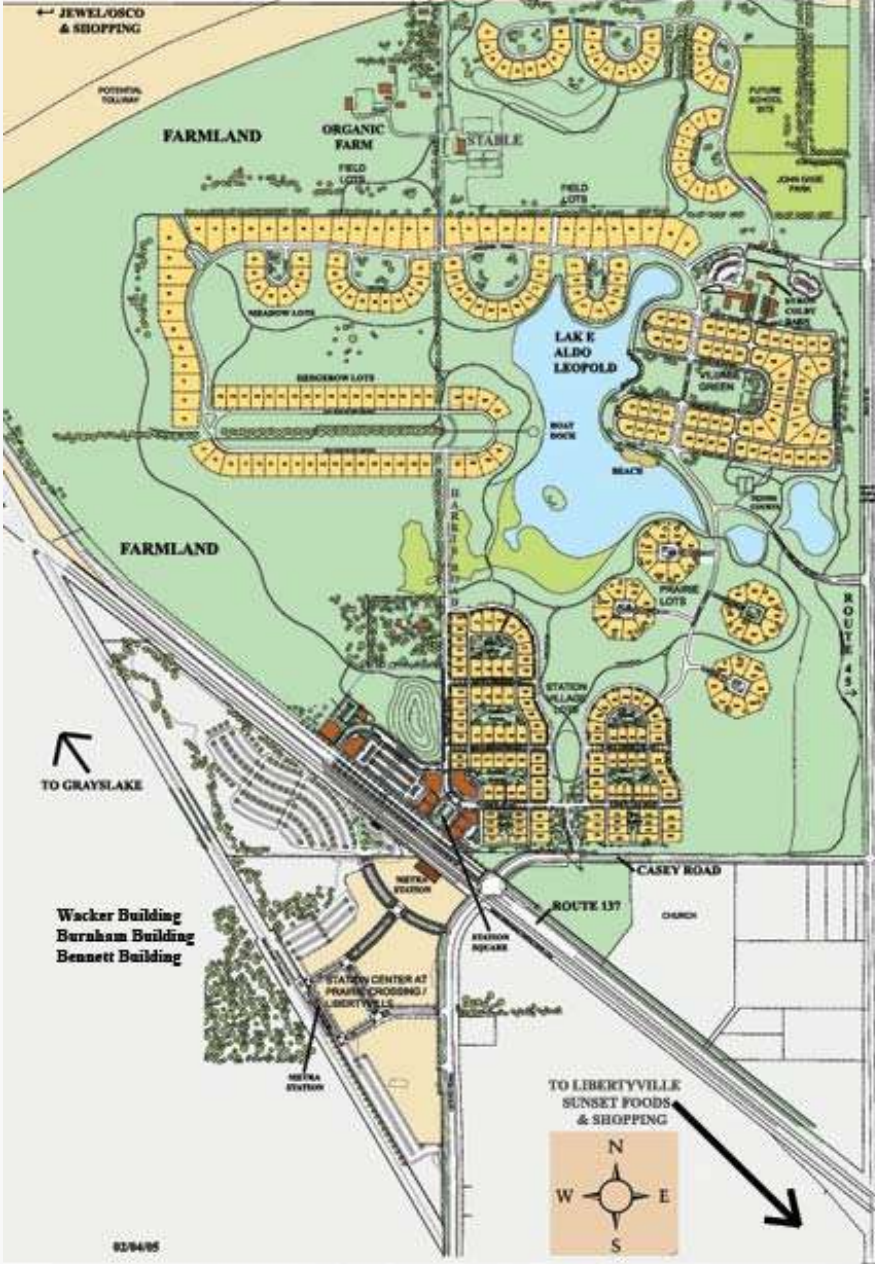

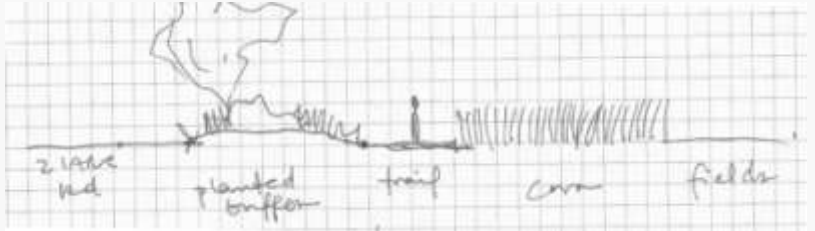
