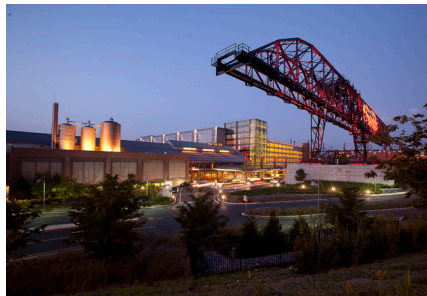
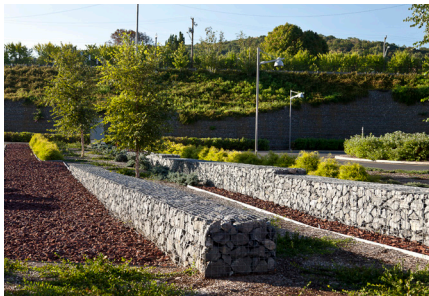


Sands Bethworks



The large landmass of the former steel mill is directly adjacent to the vibrant south side of Bethlehem, and contains a varied mix of mill buildings, blast furnaces, office buildings, cranes, trestles, and ruins. The importance of respecting the history of the site by maintaining its unique industrial setting was fully recognized by the development team. Through the adaptive reuse of existing structures and materials, this historic landmark was transformed into a new casino, a hotel, museum and mixed-use retail development. The project is seeking a LEED rating. Within the landscape SWA has implemented a number of green initiatives, including a system of bioswales and demolition material reuse in gabion walls.
